



Pupils pay tribute to the fallen in Christmas show

A school's festive production took the audience on a journey back to the front line in 1914, telling the story of the First World War Christmas truce.

Pupils from Year 5 and 6 at the Henlow Church of England Academy trod the boards yesterday, Wednesday, and on Tuesday as soldiers, nurses and families left behind. The show included the simultaneous singing of Silent Night in

both English and German, directed by English teacher Lissy Malt and French teacher Julie Stock.
