Key Stage 2 SATs Results

In 2015/16 new SATs test were introduced with new parameters for assessment, therefore, the data is not comparable with previous years. This is a national issue.

4 Year Journey at Henlow Academy – Year 5 to Year 8 Progress

Although the National Curriculum system of levels has been abolished the new testing system implemented at Henlow Academy gives a level indicator allowing a 4 year progress journey to be mapped. This is comparable with previous years. The tests administered are GL Tests which are marked and validated externally.

National expected progress over 4 years is 12 points progress.

2016 results for SWA show that 64% of all pupils gained both English and Maths GCSE A* to C, whilst 69.5% of the Henlow cohort who attended SWA reached this.

Progress 8 is a new measure introduced at the end of Year 11 for all secondary education establishments. It calculates the average progress made of the Year 11 cohort from Key Stage 2 SATs results to their attainment at the end of Key Stage 4 (Year 11). The subjects must include, English, Maths, Sciences with a combination of others subjects, totalling to 8 subjects.
