The gift of technology

Our children may well have told you about the wonderful improvements which have been made to the ICT room over the summer. New benching has been installed, new seats provided and new computers purchased. As a result we found ourselves with some computers which we needed to dispose of. These were around seven years old.

In my work in Kenya, I have bought some new computers for Utange Primary school from a company called Camara. This company has offices world wide and work by collecting donations of old computers from organisations which then have their hard drives wiped (with the necessary certification of this provided) and appropriate software installed before being sent out to developing countries to be sold on at a low cost to schools there.

Camara collected the old desktops and a number of old laptops from school, along with some computers from staff. We have received notification that all 51 computers collected will be sent out to Africa. Each computer there will benefit, on average, 21 children.

If you work in a company which has computers to get rid of, please consider donating them to Camara or a similar organisation. More information on donating through Camara is at <https://camara.org/gb/give-computers/>. These computers make a real difference in developing countries. 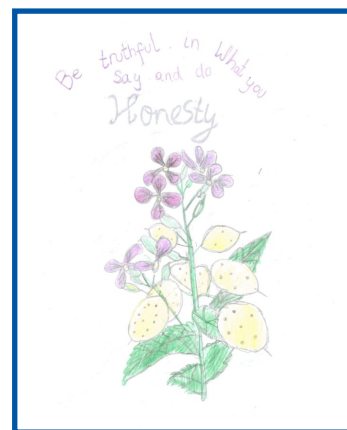

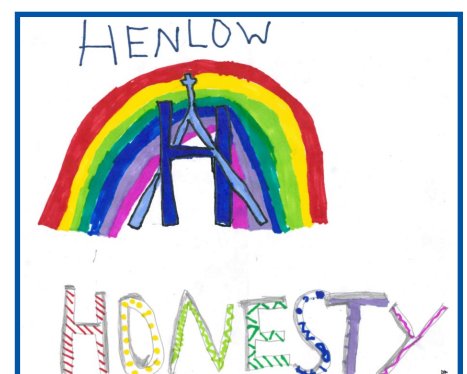
Lois Treadaway 7SP and Izzie Cooke 5NS were our overall winners, with their designs being made into our new Value postcard designs.

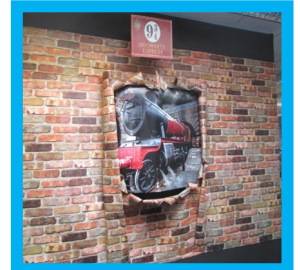
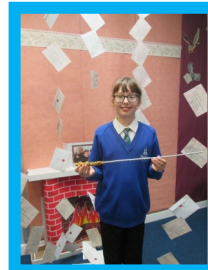
We have been running a Harry Potter book 'n' movie club. This club has been very popular and club members have been reading 'Chamber of Secrets' and we will al-

FAQ

Q. My child has a tummy bug and isn't well enough for school. What do I need to do?

A. Call the school office on 01462 813733 before 9:00am to let us know. Children should not return to school after a sickness bug for 48 hours after their last episode of sickness/diarrhoea.

Q. I need to take my child to the dentist next week, do I need to let school know?

A. Yes please! Please inform the school office. Where possible please try to make appointments outside school hours/during school holidays. If that is not possible please make them for the start or end of the school day.

Q. I sometimes struggle to get all of my 3 children to school before the school gates close, being 5-10 minutes late doesn't really make that much difference does it?

A. It is important for all children to be in school on time as it can be upsetting for the child and disruptive for the rest of the class when children are late. Children who are late need to arrive via the school office and will get a late mark.

Did you know?

- ☹ 97% attendance means your child will have missed 6 days of school throughout the year.
- ☹ 90% attendance means that your child will have been absent for the equivalent of one half day every week.
- ☹ This also means that your child will have missed the equivalent of 4 whole weeks throughout the school year!
- ☹ If you take a two week holiday during term time your child's attendance will automatically be reduced to less than 95%.
- ☹ A two week holiday each year in school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed. This is the equivalent of a whole term and can have a real impact on your child's literacy and numeracy skills.
- ☹ If your child does not attend school regularly and you fail to work with the school and The Education Welfare Service you may be fined up to £2500

Things to remember:

- ☒ Keeping children away from school is a criminal offence.
- ☒ If you do not let us know why your child is not in school their absence will be marked as unauthorised.
- ☒ Looking after other children, going shopping, waiting in are not valid reasons to keep your child off school and will be marked as unauthorised absences.
- ☒ Some parents believe that their child is automatically entitled to up to 10 days out of school a year. **THIS IS NOT TRUE!** Parents can request to take children out of school during term time by writing to the Attendance Officer. However, holidays are only granted in exceptional circumstances. Holidays taken without permission will be recorded as unauthorised and the
