Dear Parents and Carers

This morning we held our first live whole school assembly since December 2019 and we were able to truly celebrate all that we have achieved this academic year. The atmosphere was special and whilst I can't replicate that here, the content of this edition gives you an insight. It was uplifting to welcome Year 5 and 6 into our community and to enjoy our first Year 9 joining us. I have included the Roll of Honour in order that you can all see the range of ways in which Henlow students gain recognition across our community. We also applauded the Key Stage 2 SATS results that Year 6 students gained and recognised the fact that they had to dig really deep to focus on these papers.

In addition to a live whole school assembly we have enjoyed Sports Day and Sports Awards Evening. With fabulous support from families, both of these events were a resounding success. Many school records were broken on Sports Day and individual performances were rewarded with cups and medals. The way in which students supported their peer group and house achievements was wonderful to see and the Henlow spirit certainly shines through when encouragement is needed. The photo montages included here give an overview of the many trips that have taken place now that visits are possible again. I know that students enjoy these rights of passage and have truly deserved a time where they can enjoy their friendships and have fun.

I'm sure you are all aware of the considerable changes that continue to take place as areas of the school are transformed and new facilities are provided. The new library and reconfigured Art and DT rooms have been completed in the last few weeks! Currently the hall is being widened and the centre of the school will re-emerge in September as the final piece in our secondary school. Our first Year 9 move into Year 10 in September and begin their GCSEs and we are all tremendously excited about these next steps. As part of the move to 2 tier we have supported our local feeder schools to become primary and we will therefore have no Year 5 cohort joining in September. Meppershall Academy's Year 6 provision is currently based on Henlow's site and we will welcome their Year 5 in September.



At the end of a school year we enjoy reflecting on the successes and we inevitably focus on the changes for the following year. Two long-serving Teaching Assistants - Mrs Cranston and Mrs Maxwell (24 and 11 years respectively) are moving across to our sister school, Meppershall to spend more time with younger pupils. Similarly, Key Stage 2 teacher, Mrs Hindess is returning to Meppershall following a year here whilst Mr Carter and Mr Pigram are changing the way that they work and will be with us occasionally rather than full-time. We wish them all well as they make these changes and thank them for the many years they have given to Henlow.

We also see the retirement of Mrs Preece, the leader of MFL and Mrs Hardy, a Teaching Assistant who has spent 11 years at Henlow. Miss Lines is moving on to another school with more primary students and Mrs Allen is going to teach A level in another school. Mrs Upstone, Head of Art, is re-locating to the Peak District to enjoy a new area of the country. Together they have given 21 years of service to our school and we wish them well as they begin new chapters in their life.

As we are in the midst of change across Central Bedfordshire some of our Year 8 pupils will leave today and in recent weeks we have been able to offer them our best wishes and celebrate their educational journeys through the middle years. Many current Year 8 students will become Year 9 at Henlow in September following in the footsteps of the first ever Year 9 who move into Year 10.

New members of staff have been appointed to join us in September and I look forward to introducing them to you all in the next newsletter. Our first intake of secondary students into Year 7 will be in September of 2023 and our Open Evening will take place on Thursday 29th September. Our newly completed buildings and facilities will all be open and parents will be able to meet staff and current students.

At the end of a challenging but uplifting year I hope you have a relaxing summer and look forward to hearing from the students how much they have enjoyed time with friends and

family.





Pupil Equipment List



We are seeing an increasing number of pupils that are turning up to lessons without even a pen and pencil.
