Covid Update



Guidance for the Christmas holidays

If you have a positive case of COVID-19 in your household during the Christmas holidays, please ensure that you email covid@henlowacademy.org.uk with the details at the earliest opportunity. This is of particular importance if symptoms start or a test is taken between Saturday 19th and Monday 21st December as there may be implications on others within the school.

Informing us as soon as possible will enable the school to take any and all relevant actions to protect our school community.

We also ask that you inform us of any cases throughout the remainder of the holiday as this will help to inform us of the picture we are all returning to in January.

The covid email account will be monitored on a regular basis and we will respond where required.

Please remember that if anyone in the household is awaiting a test result, the whole household must isolate until a negative result is received. If you receive a positive result, the whole household must isolate for 10 days from when symptoms first appeared, or from the date of the test if there are no symptoms. **Individuals who are isolating MUST stay at home for the full isolation period.**

Central Bedfordshire Council have provided details of how all school staff, pupils and their families can access home test kits even if they do not have symptoms of COVID-19. This information can be found on the homepage of our school website.

Covid Update



What to do if your child develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID 19)

Having been identified as a close contact, if your child then develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19), they should remain at home for at least 10 days from the date when their symptoms appeared. Symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) are a new, continuous cough, or a high temperature, or a loss of, or change in, their normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia). Anyone with symptoms will be eligible for testing and this can be arranged via <https://www.nhs.uk/ask-for-a-coronavirus-test> or by calling 119.

People who do not have symptoms should not request a test unless this has been specifically requested by Public Health England or the local authority.

All other household members who remain well must stay at home and not leave the house for 10 days. This includes anyone in your 'Support Bubble'.

The 10-day isolation period starts from the day when the first person in the house became ill.

Household members should not go to work, school or public areas, and exercise should be taken within the home. If you require help with buying groceries, other shopping or picking up medication, or walking a dog, you should ask friends or family. Alternatively, you can order your shopping online and medication by phone or online.


Household members staying at home for 10 days will greatly reduce the overall amount of infection the household could pass on to others in the community.

If you are able, move any vulnerable individuals (such as the elderly and those with underlying health conditions) out of your home, to stay with friends or family for the duration of the home isolation period. If that is not possible, anyone with symptoms should try and stay as far away as possible from vulnerable members of your household.

How to stop coronavirus (COVID-19) spreading

There are things you can do to help reduce the risk of you and anyone you live with getting ill with coronavirus (COVID-19):

- wash your hands with soap and water often – do this for at least 20 seconds
- use hand sanitiser gel if soap and water are not available
- wash your hands as soon as you get home
- cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (not your hands) when you cough or sneeze
- put used tissues in the bin immediately and wash your hands afterwards


Christmas @ Henlow










Goodbye Mrs Pilgrim

With the theme 'everyone is a hero', children can take part and join the online website which includes fun activities and competitions.





Pupil Equipment



All pencil cases will have been sent home to be restocked over Christmas (pupils who were unable to take their pencil cases home due to self isolating should ensure their pencils cases are restocked in the first week of term). **Please can you ensure your child(ren) has all the right equipment they need for school everyday.** We are seeing an increasing number of pupils that are turning up to lessons without even a pen and pencil. As part of The Henlow Home School Partnership, pupils should attend school properly equipped. Please note that pupils are not able to share equipment and the school are not able to provide pupils with missing equipment.

Reminders



Please ensure all money sent into school is in a sealed envelope and has your child's name, class, what the money is for and the amount of money on the front.

Please make sure that all your child's clothes and property is clearly named. If your child has lost any items, please make sure they check lost property ASAP.

The school office aren't able to call home if your child forgets something they need that day at school. Please ensure your child checks their timetable and brings all they need each day.

ALL children are required to bring in a named water bottle daily. The school do not have cups to provide to children who do not bring a water bottle and the canteen no longer sells bottles of drinks.

We are not accepting cash at the moment. Please make payments and donations through the ParentMail app. Go to payments and then click 'shop'.

Please can all parents and carers check their child/ren's ParentMail accounts and ensure they are in credit.

Please be aware that Breakfast Club runs from 8:00am until 8:30am and must be booked in advance. Staff are not available to supervise children before 8:00am and therefore children are not authorised to be on site before this due to safeguarding and health & safety.

Don't be late!

If your child(ren) arrive after 9:20am they will be marked in late.

Let us know!

You can report your child(ren) absence from school by phone the school office on 01462 813733 or through the ParentMail app.

Things to remember!

You can be prosecuted if your child has unauthorised absences from school.

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IF YOUR CHILD IS GOING TO BE ABSENT FROM SCHOOL YOU MUST CONTACT THE SCHOOL TO LET US KNOW WHY YOUR CHILD WON'T BE IN SCHOOL OTHERWISE THE ABSENCE WILL BE UNAUTHORISED.

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Looking after other children, going shopping and waiting in for deliveries are not valid reasons to keep your child off school and will be marked as unauthorised absences.

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Parents can request to take children out of school during term time by writing to the Attendance Officer. However, holidays are only granted in exceptional circumstances. Absences taken without permission will be recorded as unauthorised and a fine will be issued.

Attendance Matters



Did you know?

- ⇒ You can report your child absence from school through the ParentMail app.
- ⇒ 97% attendance means your child will have missed 6 days of school throughout the year.
- ⇒ 90% attendance means that your child will have been absent for the equivalent of one half day every week.
- ⇒ If you take a two week holiday during term time your child's attendance will automatically be reduced to less than 95%. A two week holiday each year in school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed. This is the equivalent of a whole term and can have a real impact on your child's literacy and numeracy skills.
- ⇒ If your child does not attend school regularly and you fail to work with the school and The Education Welfare Service, you may be fined up to £2500 and in extreme cases sent to prison.

Frequently asked questions

Q. My child has a tummy bug and isn't well enough for school. What do I need to do?

A. Call the school office on 01462 813733 before 9:00am to let us know. Children should not return to school after a sickness bug for 48 hours after their last episode of sickness/diarrhoea.

Q. I need to take my child to the dentist next week, do I need to let school know?

A. Yes please! Please inform the school office. Where possible please try to make appointments outside school hours/during school holidays. If that is not possible please make them for the start or end of the school day.

Q. I sometimes struggle to get all of my 3 children to school before the school gates close, being 5-10 minutes late doesn't really make that much difference does it?

A. It is important for all children to be in school on time as it can be upsetting for the child and disruptive for the rest of the class when children are late. Children who are late need to arrive via the school office and will get a late mark.
