Dear Parents

Welcome to the first edition of our new newsletter - Henlow Heart - the name chosen by our pupils. A new name but the same focus on pupils and the huge range of endeavours they are engaged in here in school, in the wider community and further afield. A particularly warm welcome is offered to families of pupils in year 5 who have now completed their first half term here at Henlow Academy!

As I reflect on this first half term it has certainly been busy! We were at the forefront nationally when Ofsted chose our school as one of the first schools to inspect using their new framework. A high number of pupils completed the online survey and were enthusiastic in their responses to inspectors. The report comments very positively on pupils' achievements academically in addition to the way in which our school community values pupils' wider development. As I informed you last week, CBC will begin a consultation regarding the 22 schools across our area moving towards a primary/secondary model. Further details will be available after half term. Our planning permission for new science laboratories, a lift in our new block and SEND rooms is very exciting and the plans can also be viewed on our website. The refurbishment of the old gym is an aspect of the future that has certainly caught the imagination of our pupils - the transformation into a dining space is essential and the theatre will be amazing!

During the summer holiday Mrs Panton, after accompanying scouts on a trip abroad, decided to move to a role outside of education but still in the world of ICT. We paid tribute to her 17 years at our school in a whole school assembly but I know you will all want to add your best wishes too.

Four new members of teaching staff joined us in September, all of whom are familiar faces from their training- Mrs Gudgin, Ms Farrington, Miss Corcoran and Miss Smithen. New teaching assistants Mrs Morey, Mrs Green, Mrs Ryan have also joined us.

During the next half term all pupils will have the opportunity to take part in our Christmas concert and key stage 2 pupils will be rehearsing their play. House sports are taking place as I write and the quest to raise money for charities has already started. Thank you all for the contributions to the NEEd project at Harvest time - the generosity can be seen in the pictures included here.

The Worrinots application and characters have been developed with the help of some of the UK's leading child psychologists to encourage children to share their concerns and deal with them appropriately.



Attendance Matters!

Things to remember:

- You can be prosecuted if your child has unauthorised absences from school.
- If you do not let us know why your child is not in school their absence will be marked as unauthorised.
- Looking after other children, going shopping and waiting in for deliveries are not valid reasons to keep your child off school and will be marked as unauthorised absences.
- Parents can request to take children out of school during term time by writing to the Attendance Officer. However, holidays are only granted in exceptional circumstances. Absences taken without permission will be recorded as unauthorised and a fine will be issued.

<u>FAQ</u>

Q. My child has a tummy bug and isn't well enough for school. What do I need to do?

A. Call the school office on 01462 813733 before 9:00am to let us know. Children should not return to school after a sickness bug for 48 hours after their last episode of sickness/diarrhoea.

Q. I need to take my child to the dentist next week, do I need to let school know?

A. Yes please! Please inform the school office. Where possible please try to make appointments outside school hours/during school holidays. If that is not possible please make them for the start or end of the school day.

Q. I sometimes struggle to get all of my 3 children to school before the school gates close, being 5-10 minutes late doesn't really make that much difference does it?

A. It is important for all children to be in school on time as it can be upsetting for the child and disruptive for the rest of the class when children are late. Children who are late need to arrive via the school office and will get a late mark.

Did you know?

- 97% attendance means your child will have missed 6 days of school throughout the year.
- 90% attendance means that your child will have been absent for the equivalent of one half day every week.
- If you take a two week holiday during term time your child's attendance will automatically be reduced to less than 95%.
- A two week holiday each year in school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed. This is the equivalent of a whole term and can have a real impact on your child's literacy and numeracy skills.
- If your child does not attend school regularly and you fail to work with the school and The Education Welfare Service, you may be fined up to £2500 and in extreme cases sent to prison.

General Reminders

Please ensure all money sent into school is in a sealed envelope and has your child's name, class, what the money is for and the amount of money on the front.

The school office aren't always able to call home if your child forgets something they need that day at school. Please ensure your child checks their timetable and brings all they need each day.

If a club/fixture is cancelled on the day it is meant to occur, we will send a message home via ParentMail. Your child will be sent to the homework club after school which finishes at 4:45pm unless you contact the school providing alternative arrangements which you would like them to do. We are unable to ring all parents individually and ask what their preference is for their child.

Please make sure that all your child's clothes and property is clearly named. If your child has lost any items please make sure they check lost property ASAP.

> ALL children are required to bring in a named water bottle daily. The school do not have cups to provide to children who do not bring a water bottle and the canteen no longer sells bottles of drinks. Bottles can be purchased from the school shop.

Remember!

Please can all parents and carers check their child/ren's ParentMail accounts and ensure they are in credit. We are not able to provide snacks at break time to anyone who is overdrawn.

Please be aware that Breakfast Club runs from 8:00am until 8:30am.

Staff are not available to supervise children before 8:00am and therefore children are not authorised to be on site before this due to safeguarding and health & safety.

If you are interested in your child attending Breakfast Club, the cost is $\pounds 3$ per day.
