

PREPARATION TIMELINE

It might seem likes ages away but if you take the time to research and plan now you can make more confident choices - and complete your applications earlier. So, you've got more time to focus on your GCSEs.

SUMMER TERM YEAR 10

- Think about your future strengths and favourite subjects.
- Find out more about careers that interest you.
- Think about how your strengths might fit with your career ideas.
- Discuss your ideas with people whose opinions you value.
- Do some online research into the local college and training options.

AUTUMN TERM YEAR 11

- Build confidence in strengths and favourite subjects.
- Go to information events and learn about all the different options.
- Book some taster sessions.
- Check college application deadlines. Some colleges might require an application this term.
- Make contact with employers if seeking an Apprenticeship.

SPRING TERM YEAR 11


- Complete applications (key dates will be given out in Y11) but most applications are completed by the end of January.
- Attend interviews.
- Attend additional taster events.
- Work hard to secure an apprenticeship placement.
- Make sure you have a back-up plan.

SUMMER TERM YEAR 11

- Concentrate on exam prep.
- Finalise your placement if intending on an Apprenticeship.
- Attend any summer transitions days after exams. Many colleges run welcome events.

There are numerous career progression routes available, each tailored to suit different individuals. The key is selecting the most suitable path to reach your goals.

For instance, you may opt for BTEC's, T Levels or A Levels to pursue a university degree, or alternatively, consider apprenticeships, which offer the opportunity to combine work and study.


A T Level gives you a mix of learning in the classroom and on the job. Businesses and employers helped design T Levels to teach you the skills you'll need.

Engaging in a foundation course is a way to boost your confidence, enhance your knowledge, and develop essential skills. You can pursue these studies at a college or with an independent training provider.



















APPRENTICESHIPS

An apprenticeship is a paid job with training where you work alongside experienced staff, gaining job-specific skills and earning a wage. You follow an apprenticeship standard outlining the knowledge, skills, and behaviours needed for success.

Entry Requirements


Don't worry if you don't meet the exact entry requirements – providers like colleges and sixth forms are here to help.

They'll always take your personal circumstances into account and support you in finding the course that's right for you.

It's really important to achieve Grade 4 or above in English and Maths, as it opens more doors for your future. But if you don't quite get there, you'll have the chance to work towards it as part of your study programme.

Some courses may ask for specific GCSEs at grade 4 or above, depending on the subject. This will be explained when you speak with a tutor from the course area.

Entry requirements can vary between different courses, but the guide below gives a general idea of what's usually expected.



Local Sixth Form & FE Colleges

When you finish Year 11, you'll have lots of choices for continuing your education. Many schools have a sixth form where you can study A Levels, vocational courses, or a mix of both — all school based sixth forms s are listed on pages 16-19 for you to explore.

If you're looking for something different, there are also colleges and larger sixth form centres in your area that provide a wide range of subjects, specialist facilities, and opportunities to meet new people. Here are some of the main ones across Bedfordshire, Milton Keynes, and Northamptonshire:

These are ideal for meeting colleges, training providers, apprenticeship providers, employers, and careers advisers.

2

Discuss your ideas

Talk to parents or carers, family and friends to get other viewpoints on your choices.

3

Get advice

Talk to teachers and career advisers – they have lots of knowledge and wisdom to share!

4

Open events and taster sessions

They're a great opportunity to visit schools and colleges, find out about the courses on offer, and speak to staff and students.

5

It's your life and your choice

Don't be influenced by where your friends are going. Ask yourself: what do I enjoy? What would I like to do and what do I want to get out of my life?
