Dear parents and carers

I am writing this as we prepare for our virtual Easter assembly this afternoon. We are making the most of the digital opportunities available to us but we are also hopeful of a return to whole school gatherings in the sports hall to celebrate these occasions together. During this summer term she will be remaining at Henlow Academy for half of each week and beginning her new role in Year 4/5 for the other two and a half days.

Photography, baking and reading were certainly high profile this term and these pursuits are well represented in this edition of the newsletter. Since a full return to school became possible, attendance has been high and pupils have enjoyed the opportunity to engage with their learning alongside their peers. The atmosphere in lessons is positive and we are so proud of the way in which pupils are focussing on their work across the curriculum.



Asymptomatic Testing










Now that in school testing has been completed, all pupils have been provided with three home test kits (totalling 9 tests) to use twice weekly at home. Parents are required to report the results (both positive and negative) to the NHS. They are also required to report the result to the school. We have created and circulated a google form for this purpose. This week we have provided more tests to the pupils to ensure pupils have enough for the first week of the Summer term whilst we await further guidance from the Government.



We would like to thank the team of staff who volunteered to run our testing facility. They did an amazing job setting up the centre and carrying out so many tests, so smoothly.


School Action Group

Year 9 Update



We are entering a really exciting time for Henlow Academy as we prepare to have our first cohort of Year 9's in September 2021.

We have started to recruit more staff ready for our move to be an extended secondary school. We are currently recruiting Head's of Department for English, Computing, Design Technology and History due to promotions and staff retirements. This week we employed another Art teacher to join us in September to increase our capacity in our creative subjects. In the following 2 pages you will see how our current building work is coming along. Our Year 9's will be the first to use our 4 new state of the art science labs in September 2021. Over half term the wall separating Art Room 1 and Art Room 2 was taken down creating a large art area suitable for secondary pupils. Plans are well under way for a brand new food technology room, dedicated graphics room and textile room. The plans also include a huge new computer room and a relocated library/resource centre. These should hopefully be up and running July 2022 ready for the Year 9's to move into their Key Stage 4 journey. It really is a very exciting time at Henlow Academy!

After Easter we will be unveiling our new uniform for Year 9 pupils which our Key Stage 4 Ambassadors have been involved in choosing. Mia and Rosa, two of our Key Stage 4 ambassadors said:

'Over the past few months we have had several meetings with Mr Baxter and even Mrs Earp, discussing our opinions and what to look forward to in Year 9. We have made decisions about uniforms for the coming years and also the placement of lockers and their bright colours. Since Henlow is extending a new building is being built, and we've had the opportunity to step onto the building site and look at the foundations before Henlow changes for the better. We got to put on hi vis jackets and hard helmets, some of us even got to put the spade into the ground! Before every meeting, we would ask our class for their ideas and then we would request those ideas to Mr Baxter and the team, to see if they could become a reality.'



Photography Competition









Click and Deliver

Our 'click and deliver' service is operating once again so that pupils can continue to borrow school library resources and this will continue in the summer term. Pupils can reserve books via our reading cloud system and when resources become available, they will be delivered to pupils. The link to the
