

Choose 6 pieces of kitchen equipment to explain how and why they would be used.






Keep a food diary to record what you eat in one day.

Create a visual representation (puzzle, map with labels) showing the Earth's major tectonic plates. Label the plate boundaries and explain how the movement and interaction of these plates lead to the formation of volcanoes and the occurrence of earthquakes.



DISASTER DIARY

Choose one of the natural disasters
(volcano, earthquake, or tsunami) and
write a series of diary entries from the
perspective of someone who
experienced it. Your entries should
describe the causes of the event, what
it felt like, and the immediate effects.
Include scientific explanations within
your narrative.



TSUNAMI TRAVEL BROCHURE

Create a travel brochure for a coastal region that is prone to tsunamis. Your brochure should educate potential visitors about what tsunamis are (causes and effects), how they are formed (linking it to earthquakes or volcanic activity), and safety precautions they should take in case of a tsunami warning. Use informative text and visuals.



EARTHQUAKE ENGINEERING CHALLENGE

Design and build a structure (using materials like straws, marshmallows, or LEGOs) that can withstand simulated earthquake shaking. In a written report, explain the design features you incorporated to make your structure earthquake-resistant and discuss how real-world engineers design buildings to withstand seismic activity. Explain the relationship between earthquake intensity and plate boundaries

EXPERT INTERVIEW

Research and prepare interview questions for a volcanologist, seismologist, or tsunami expert. While you won't actually conduct the interview, your questions should demonstrate your understanding of the causes and effects of these events and the role of tectonic plates. Write out the questions and anticipated informed answers based on your research.



NATURAL DISASTER NEWS REPORT

Create a news report (written or video) about a specific historical or fictional volcano, earthquake, or tsunami event. Your report should cover the causes, the immediate effects, and the long-term consequences of the disaster. Explain the underlying geological processes involved.



Listen to a historical podcast.



Practice learning basic geography for history using a map quiz or to test your knowledge with a game.



Watch a documentary or YouTube video on the topics you are studying.



Do some historical reading (fiction and non-fiction texts are available).



Visit a historical site (relevant locations suggested on Google Classroom).







PLATINUM


