Science @ Henlow

This term our Key Stage 4 groups have started with a unit on Ecology, making the most of the unseasonably warm weather to complete sampling with quadrats on our school field. We learned about different sampling techniques used by Scientists to measure abundance and distribution of different plant species but our most exciting find was a grass snake.

Year 7 have settled into Science well and are now fully fledged Henlow Scientists, earning their Bunsen Burner Safety Certificates. They have completed their Science Induction, learning about the equipment we use and how we record in Science. There have been lots of excellent practical skills demonstrated through extracting salt from rock salt and separating mixtures.

Science clubs are now up and running with CREST Explorers for our younger pupils and CREST awards for those hoping to complete project work towards a CREST Bronze or Silver award. Revision has begun with Key Stage 4 students who have been rediscovering cells and magnification calculations and being introduced to Kay science online revision resources purchased to support them in their independent study.



We had a fantastic open evening and are grateful to all the pupils who gave up their time to become Science demonstrators for the evening. They really were excellent STEM ambassadors. Thank you and well done.

Next half term we look forward to the Year 10 trip to the Science Museum in London and some Key Stage 4 students will also be attending a conference on Aeronautical engineering at St Francis school in Letchworth.





The Library Round up

It's been a busy half term in the library. We have introduced some changes to the opportunities available in the library.

Monday lunchtime - Open to Year 10 and 11 only. Students have access to Chromebooks if they need to study/research.

Tuesday lunchtime - Book Club - This term the group have selected their own books to read and after half term we will be sharing books that we have enjoyed. The club has also been given the opportunity to suggest and recommend Key Stage 4 resources for the library. We hope that their suggestions will assist with stock selection as we continue to increase the resources for this key stage.

Thursday lunchtime - Newspaper/Writing Club - The team are writing articles for our school newspaper which will include a range of topics from school events and activities within Henlow Academy, local news/politics, staff interviews, book news, competitions plus lots more!. The team is working towards a 'winter' 1st edition.

This year we have launched a new 'Values Reward Card' at Henlow. This gives students the opportunity to earn rewards for demonstrating Henlow's core values. Students can collect a reward card from the library. Pupil Premium

Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

If you think you are eligible please contact Central Bedfordshire on the number below. As well as receiving the option to have Free School Meals you may also be entitled to a variety of initiatives at school. These may include free access to Breakfast Club, support with the cost of Food Tech, help towards uniform, subsidised music lessons, help towards the cost of school trips as well as other initiatives throughout the year.

The qualifying benefits to receive free school meals for children in Year 3 and over are:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit

• Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and your annual gross income does not exceed £16,190 as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs)

- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (during the initial roll-out of this benefit)

If you think you meet the free school meals eligibility criteria, please call Central Bedfordshire Council on 0300 300 8306. When you call to apply for free school meals, please have the following information ready:

- National Insurance numbers and dates of birth for you and your partner
- dates of birth for your children
- if you receive support from the National Asylum Support Service, your NASS number

The school will then be informed and you will receive further information. Stock Your Pencil Case!

All children need to have a NAMED water bottle with them everyday.

Please make sure that all your child's clothes and property is clearly named and that name labels haven't worn off.

The school office aren't able to call home if your child forgets something. Please ensure your child checks their timetable and brings all they need each day.
