

Good attendance is important because:

- Statistics show a direct link between underachievement and attendance below 96%
- Regular attenders make better progress, both socially and academically, and enjoy learning more.
- Regular attenders find school; routines, work and friendships easier to cope with.
- Regular attenders are more successful in transitioning between primary school, secondary school and higher education, employment or training.

What can you do as a parent to support good attendance?

- Ensure your child has had enough sleep and set an alarm clock to ensure that you are up in good time in the morning.
- Create good routines for mornings at home so everyone's mornings can start calmly.
- Ensure your child has the right uniform, equipment, PE kit and has had breakfast to get them off to the best start for the day.
- Arrive at school on time, being late disrupts your child's learning and that of the rest of the class.
- Make medical, dental, optical, and other appointments outside of school time where possible.
- If you have an appointment in school time, attend school before and after the appointment (for example, if you have an appointment at 12 noon, your child can attend school before the appointment and for the afternoon session)
- If your child is not able to attend school that day, telephone the school first thing in the morning to explain why they are unable to attend
- Talk to your child about their school day and support with the completion of homework.
- Read all communication from the school and attend parents' afternoons/evenings and other events at the school to be part of the community and school family.
- Do not take your child on holiday, shopping, on day trips, birthday treats or family occasions in term time, as you have 13 weeks school holidays and weekends for these things.

Let's read the information below: (this is stage one: look)

Revision is the process of 'looking again': studying information that has been studied before. The most effective way to do this is through retrieval which means getting all the information you can remember out of your head and there are a variety of ways you can do this. It can be written or verbal but the most effective way is when you have no cues to help you!

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Now write down everything you can remember: it doesn't need to be word-for-word but must include what revision is and what retrieval is! We are now completing stages two & three: cover and write.



Finally (and this is the most important stage), take a different colour pen and look back at the information. If you have missed anything out or written anything down incorrectly, change it with your different colour pen and make a note of the parts you struggled to remember – this is being aware of your targets!

How to revise in English

- Create Spider diagrams on key themes and key characters-three key parts of each text
- Support these ideas with quotes-students need to learn quotes for English. Students can create flashcards with a character name/theme on one side and a quote on another. You show them the name and they give you the quote.
- Practise exam questions- AQA offer a link on it's website for subjects, so students can access old exam papers.
