We began life in 1976 as a middle school and are now fully established as a thriving secondary school. The journey has been an incredible one for our community and we invite you to come and join us as you take your next steps.



The surrounding countryside has always been a wonderful feature of our setting but the buildings themselves have been transformed in recent years. If you have visited before, be prepared for a few surprises, including a brand new 2 storey building with a four court sports hall, large classrooms and incredible science laboratories. However, it may be the transformation of the original buildings that takes your breath away - the old gym has become an auditorium, a food technology suite and graphics facilities impress upstairs and the new library (Henlow Hub) dominates the centre of the school. I hope the descriptions and photographs convince you to come and visit to see the incredible developments for yourself.

As a secondary school we now have superb facilities and offer a curriculum full of possibilities designed to develop the interests of our young people. As they progress throughout the school they begin selecting which areas they wish to pursue further in Years 7 and 8. They have an increased choice alongside a community option in Year 9 and ultimately those subjects they wish to focus on at GCSE/BTEC level. Our commitment in our curriculum and staffing matches the investment in our new buildings. Staff, parents, and most of all students are proud of our recent GCSE/BTEC results. 
We have focussed on the uplifting ways in which Henlow Church of England Academy has changed as it has become a secondary school but our final points draw attention to what hasn't changed. As a community our ambition is driven by our ethos - every young person deserves to enjoy their learning by receiving the right blend of nurture and challenge. A genuine warmth and sense of community defines our approach and underpins all aspects of Henlow life. As teenagers make important decisions about the person that they ultimately want to become, we build positive relationships with them and ensure that they are supported to be the fully rounded person they hope to be.

Henlow Academy proudly stands as the founding member of the Poppy Hill Multi Academy Trust, which now includes Meppershall Academy. We cultivate robust partnerships within our trust, with our feeder primary schools, the Diocese of St Albans, and a broad network of community and charity organisations.

The Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools (SIAMS) report, published in March 2025, offers true insight into our academy, affirming that "Henlow Church of England Academy is living up to its foundation as a Church school and is enabling pupils and adults to flourish". This positive evaluation is consistently validated by our Ofsted inspections, where we have maintained a 'Good' rating. In our latest Ofsted inspection in April 2025, the school achieved 'Good' judgments across all areas, including the quality of education, behaviour and attitudes, personal development, and leadership and management. The report notably highlighted our success in balancing holistic growth with academic success, stating, "Pupils benefit from a curriculum which allows them to develop personally as well as achieve academically".

In addition to the core academic curriculum, students at Henlow Academy benefit from a unique opportunity to shape their own learning journey through our innovative Options Programme. In Years 7 and 8, pupils choose from a diverse range of elective subjects designed to stretch and challenge, spark new interests, and develop skills for future careers. In Year 9, students continue to deepen their knowledge across the traditional English Baccalaureate subjects—English, Maths, Science, Languages, Geography, History, and Computer Science—while also engaging in a broad mix of foundation subjects that provide a well-rounded preparation for Key Stage 4.

Year 9 also introduces The Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award, offering students valuable experiences beyond the classroom and helping to build confidence, teamwork, and resilience.

As a Church of England school with a strong community ethos, we believe in the value of a holistic education with Religious Education and a Modern Foreign Language remaining a core part of the Year 9 curriculum, ensuring all students continue to develop both cultural understanding and spiritual awareness.

Our Curriculum Year 10 & 11

Key Stage 4 at Henlow Academy offers a carefully balanced combination of core subjects and optional choices, enabling students to design a personalised programme that supports their individual needs, interests, and future ambitions.

The core curriculum includes English Literature, English Language, Mathematics, Combined Science (Trilogy), Religious Education, Core PE and Games, and Personal, Social, Health, and Careers Education (PSHCE).

Alongside these compulsory subjects, students choose four additional options from a broad and diverse range. These include (but are not limited to): Triple Science, Computer Science, Geography, History, French, Art, Business, Drama, Music, PE, and Psychology. Where appropriate, additional support is available through practical learning opportunities focused on literacy, numeracy, and financial education, such as money management.




