Dear parents/carers

Today is difficult to sum up in words - the jumpers, the cards, the carols, the wrapping paper, secret Santa, Christmas lunch, virtual assembly and, of course, a whole school rendition of the 12 Days of Christmas. Performed for the first time outside in order to keep everyone as safe as possible. Henlow tradition dictates that new members of staff lead the singing! Today we have celebrated Christmas in style and I'm proud to say that all members of the community smiled a lot! Thanks to parents and carers for helping us to plan for today - the festive dress/hats/jumpers/ etc have added to the amazing atmosphere and the photos later in this newsletter try to capture it. The entries for the official Christmas card were of a high standard and the winning two (by Chloe and Flora) have now been printed, written and sent across the community.

Until today we have focussed on learning and the range of activities is represented in this bumper edition of our newsletter. Year 8 pupils are engaged in a range of taster activities, beginning with dissection in Biology and slime production in Chemistry. More tasters to come in Graphics, Textiles and Food in the Spring term. Our first Year 9 cohort are engaged across the curriculum and also enjoying new areas, especially their Duke of Edinburgh endeavours. Details of PE activities abound and even though the pandemic has presented some challenges, the opportunities and progress made in these areas is impressive. New possibilities in DT have also opened up this term and a wide range of projects have been embarked upon with renewed vigour.

The new building opened on time in September and we have enjoyed the new classrooms, wide corridors, bright walls and lockers in addition to the specialist Science facilities. More recently the outside groundwork has been completed and we now have full access to a beautiful courtyard with planting and benches. As we approach the end of this term the Year 5/6 area that has been totally re-configured and transformed is nearing completion and the new area will be open in January. I have witnessed this progress at close hand as my office is very close to the scaffolding and it is so pleasing to see the rejuvenation taking shape.







Next term another phase of development begins and although this requires re-timetabling and a move of classrooms, we are getting closer to the finish line of new facilities throughout.

The backdrop to my writing this Christmas message is a disconcerting one as Covid 19 new variant cases are rising. Throughout this term we have prioritised health and safety and of course focused on teaching and learning. Our community is dear to all of us and we will continue to work together to meet the needs of all students in January. Our published plans include in-school LF testing for secondary pupils on Tuesday 4th January and details of the National Theatre school at home work for this day have been given to all students, in addition to being published on our website. All students return on Wednesday 5th January.

My own Christmas plans include plenty of sleep and time with my family (and pets).







We are very excited to see phase 1 of the reconfiguration of our original building is nearly complete. This will see 8 teaching rooms handed back for use including a dedicated textiles, graphics and ICT suite along with 5 general classrooms. Seeing the new set up of the rooms, now with proper corridors running through the area it is so difficult to imagine what the Year 5 and 6 area used to look like!

Phase 2 starts in January which will see a brand new food technology room created, SEND and pastoral dedicated rooms, extension of one of our existing labs and a general classroom.



Geography Club






We also knew there was a buddha garden nearby and we decided to go there and look at the gigantic buddha statues with Henry. We also went to see some wild flamingos in their natural




habitat and they were all white flamingos and very nice and cool. Henry enjoyed seeing them and so did I.

Pupil Equipment List





All pencil cases will have been sent home to be restocked over Christmas. Please can you ensure your child(ren) has all the right equipment they need for school everyday. We are seeing an increasing number of pupils that are turning up to lessons without even a pen and pencil. As part of The Henlow Home School Partnership, pupils should attend school properly equipped. If you are unable to provide stationery for any reason please contact your child's form tutor who will be able to help.

All pupils needs a pencil case which contains ALL of the following:

- Cartridge pen, handwriting pen or a friction pen (blue)
- 30cm ruler
- HB pencil and a spare
- 2 Dry wipe board marker pen and a wiper/cloth
- Coloured pencils (not felt tips)
- Ink eraser pen (if using a cartridge pen)
- Green pen (friction pen preferred)
- Rubber
- Pencil sharpener (which can collect shavings)
- Glue Stick
- Scissors
- Highlighters
- Scientific calculator (ESSENTIAL FOR KEY STAGE 3 MATHS)
- Protractor
- Headphones (suitable to be plugged into any tablet)

All pupils need to have a pair of headphones suitable for being plugged into any tablet. Stationery and headphones can make excellent **Christmas** presents!





Could you be entitled to Pupil Premium Funding support?

Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

If you think you are eligible please contact Central Bedfordshire on the number below. As well as receiving the option to have Free School Meals you may also be entitled to a variety of initiatives at school. These may include free access to Breakfast Club and 4:45 club, support with the cost of Food Tech, help towards uniform, subsidised music lessons, help towards the cost of school trips as well as other initiatives throughout the year.

The qualifying benefits to receive free school meals for children in Year 3 and over are:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and your annual gross income does not exceed £16,190 as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs)
- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (during the initial roll-out of this benefit)

If you think you meet the free school meals eligibility criteria, please call Central Bedfordshire Council on 0300 300 8306. When you call to apply for free school meals, please have the following information ready:

- National Insurance numbers and dates of birth for you and your partner
- dates of birth for your children
- if you receive support from the National Asylum Support Service, your NASS number

The school will then be informed and you will receive further information. Don't be late!

If your child(ren) arrive after 9:00am they will be marked in late.

Let us know!

You can report your child(ren) absence from school by phone the school office on 01462 813733 or through the ParentMail app.

Things to remember!

You can be prosecuted if your child has unauthorised absences from school.

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IF YOUR CHILD IS GOING TO BE ABSENT FROM SCHOOL YOU MUST CONTACT THE SCHOOL TO LET US KNOW WHY YOUR CHILD WON'T BE IN SCHOOL OTHERWISE THE ABSENCE WILL BE UNAUTHORISED.

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Looking after other children, going shopping and waiting in for deliveries are not valid reasons to keep your child off school and will be marked as unauthorised absences.

Parents can request to take children out of school during term time by writing to the Attendance Officer. However, holidays are only granted in exceptional circumstances. Absences taken without permission will be recorded as unauthorised and a fine will be issued.

Attendance Matters





Did you know?

- ⇒ You can report your child absence from school through the ParentMail app.
- \Rightarrow 97% attendance means your child will have missed 6 days of school throughout the year.
- \Rightarrow 90% attendance means that your child will have been absent for the equivalent of one half day every week.
- ⇒ If you take a two week holiday during term time your child's attendance will automatically be reduced to less than 95%. A two week holiday each year in school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed. This is the equivalent of a whole term and can have a real impact on your child's literacy and numeracy skills.
- \Rightarrow If your child does not attend school regularly and you fail to work with the school and The Education Welfare Service, you may be fined up to £2500 and in extreme cases sent to prison.

Frequently asked questions

Q. My child has a tummy bug and isn't well enough for school. What do I need to do?

A. Call the school office on 01462 813733 before 9:00am to let us know. Children should not return to school after a sickness bug for 48 hours after their last episode of sickness/diarrhoea.

Q. I need to take my child to the dentist next week, do I need to let school know?

- A. Yes please! Please inform the school office. Where possible please try to make appointments outside school hours/during school holidays. If that is not possible please make them for the start or end of the school day.
- Q. I sometimes struggle to get all of my 3 children to school before the school gates close, being 5-10 minutes late doesn't really make that much difference does it?

A. It is important for all children to be in school on time as it can be upsetting for the child and disruptive for the rest of the class when children are late. Children who are late need to arrive via the school office and will get a late mark.
