To the community of Henlow Church of England Academy,

My name is Niamh Taylor, and I first joined youth parliament at the beginning of Year 8 at Henlow. For the new term of youth parliament for the next 2 years, I have been re-elected into central Bedfordshire youth parliament representing my constituency of Henlow Academy as a current Year 10.

Along with applying for the position in youth parliament, everyone must present 3 key issues which appear to be important to ourselves, or within our constituencies. The three I have chosen are as follows:

- Mental health
- Social media
- LGBTQ+

These three issues are, I feel, amongst the biggest and most prolific topics impacting the youth of Central Bedfordshire. I also consider these to be important as firstly, the mental health of young people must be addressed and we need to see an increase in improvements in help for these young people's mental health services. Secondly, the education within schools on social media can be substandard, and therefore more awareness of this matter needs to be raised, for example, by providing and delivering more PSHCE lessons for ages 12 and above about staying safe on social media. And last but not least, LGBTQ+ has become a huge part of today's youth and I believe it is necessary that awareness and understanding should be raised for the support and integration of this community.

Every two years, the UK Youth Parliament runs a 'Make your Mark ballot' for 11-18 year-olds in the UK. It's your chance to say what issues matter to you the most. And they want to hear from as many of you as possible to get your opinions heard. The next ballot is in February 2024. For this, a form will be sent around to every form tutor within our school for our student body to have their opinions and views heard. This ballot for 2024 contains 10 key issues for the UK youth parliament to choose to campaign about for the next 2 years. These key issues are:

- Education and learning
- International Relations
- Health & wellbeing
- Rights, Equalities & Democracy
- Jobs, the Economy & Benefits
- Crime & Safety
- Culture, Media, Sports
- Climate Change and the Environment
- Transport
- Youth Work & Young People's Services

Within my role in youth parliament, I will bring a strong sense of leadership and cooperation. As well as this I genuinely care about the issues the youth face and their future, our future. Today's youth face a myriad of challenges, and we must have representatives who understand these problems.

I look forward to working on your behalf.

Youth Parliament



By accurately measuring, offsetting and committing to reduce emissions by 2030, Henlow Church of England Academy is not only Carbon Neutral, but in alignment with both Science Based and UK Government targets for Carbon Emissions reductions.

School Transport Consultation

Central Bedfordshire Council have published a letter outlinging proposed changes to their 'Home to School Transport Policy'. Further details of the proposed changes can be found here: <u>https://www.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/info/38/consultations/1590/consultations home to school transport policy changes 2024</u>

One of the proposed changes will mean that students will only be eligible for transport to their 'nearest' school. This would apply to all new students on entry into Year 7 at Henlow from September 2025 (or 'in year' applications during the 24/25 academic year). It is not yet clear how the current pause of the Schools for the Future programme will impact this with Henlow being the only school in the cluster with a point of entry at Year 7. We are also waiting for Central Bedfordshire Council to confirm how this will impact students in Meppershall's year 5 & 6 who are currently educated on the Henlow site. As a Trust, we are concerned that the Local Authority has not considered the impact on students and families and that this proposal does not take into account the best interests of children or the current two tier/three tier situation in our locality.

There is currently an open consultation allowing parents/carers to have their say on these

changes, the deadline for responses to be submitted is Wednesday 3rd April. The Poppy Hill Church of England Multi Academy Trust will be lodging a formal response on behalf of both of our schools. We would encourage parents/carers to respond also and ask that you let us know of any concerns such that we can ensure that we are taking the needs of local families into account in our formal response. Childcare Offers for Parents

The Childcare Choices campaign aims to raise awareness and understanding of the support available from the government with the costs of childcare.

You can help ensure your parents and carers aren't missing out by directing them to <u>https://www.childcarechoices.gov.uk/</u> where they can easily find the right offers of childcare support for them.

With the school Christmas holidays approaching and looking ahead to half term in February, it is more important than ever that your parents and carers are able to access the financial support they qualify for. They could be entitled to:

- up to £2,000 a year of Tax-Free Childcare per child (or £4,000 if disabled) for children up to 11, or 17 if they're disabled
- help with up to 85% of their childcare costs for children up to 16 with Universal Credit
- 30 hours of free childcare for 3 and 4 year olds if they're a working family in England.



Free School Meals Eligibility and Entitlement

Emergency support

Emergency provision is available following an emergency or crisis to meet the immediate day-to-day expenses relating to food and utilities. Supermarket vouchers and top-ups for pre-paid energy meters are provided to meet these needs.

To be eligible for the emergency provision you must be:

- permanently residing within Central Bedfordshire
- 16 years or older
- in an emergency situation and not have enough money to meet the immediate needs of you and your family

• able to provide sufficient proof of identity You do not need to be in receipt of any benefit or entitlement. Find out more <u>on our website</u>.

Are you eligible for Free School Meals?

If you think you are eligible please contact Central Bedfordshire on the number below. As well as receiving the option to have Free School Meals you may also be entitled to a variety of initiatives at school. These may include free access to Breakfast Club, support with the cost of Food Tech, help towards uniform, subsidised music lessons, help towards the cost of school trips as well as other initiatives throughout the year.

The qualifying benefits to receive free school meals for children in Year 3 and over are:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part IV of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The Guarantee element of State Pension Credit

• Child Tax Credit (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit, and your annual gross income does not exceed £16,190 as assessed by Her Majesty's Revenue and Customs)

- Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit)
- Universal Credit (during the initial roll-out of this benefit)

If you think you meet the free school meals eligibility criteria, please call Central Bedfordshire Council on 0300 300 8306. When you call to apply for free school meals, please have the following information ready:

- National Insurance numbers and dates of birth for you and your partner
- dates of birth for your children
- if you receive support from the National Asylum Support Service, your NASS number

The school will then be informed and you will receive further information.
