Welcome to the first edition of Henlow Heart this academic year. Thank you all so much for working with us in our endeavours to keep our school a safe place during this unusual time. All of our adjustments to timings in order to reduce group sizes and preserve bubbles has taken a while to become routine but pupils are now at ease in their school environment.

Our Harvest Festival brought us all together as it always has through hymn, reflection and celebration and whilst we are all looking forward to returning to our whole school assemblies, the virtual gathering was successful.

Our priority is to ensure that learning can take place in an environment that is as safe as we can make it. An email address (covid@henlowacademy.org.uk) is dedicated to any questions you may have or any information you may wish to share with us. Families have let us know essential information and this has again ensured that we can keep safety at the forefront of our planning. In addition to ensuring that learning takes place in school we have continued to plan for any occasion when home learning becomes necessary.

Our building programme is currently running to time - the Lodge is due to be completed in January and the old gym is on track to become a theatre by February. The impressive science facilities and new classroom block will be completed by September 2021. Year 8 pupils are able to get an insight into the facilities currently being designed as they prepare to become the very first Year 9 cohort.

Henlow Academy's warm ethos was certainly at the forefront of the BBC Look East filming that took place last week. Mrs Coster had promised to come into school as soon as she possibly could and it is absolutely remarkable that she was able to do this so quickly following her hospital rehabilitation. Meeting her form group was emotional and talking to pupils who raised money of their own volition during lockdown brought a tear to many an eye - including breakfast TV presenters.

I know that the current era is a demanding one but I am so grateful for the support of parents and carers as we find our way through this. Throughout September we focused explicitly on the well being of pupils and we continue to support in the ways we have always done. The academic challenge is also important and the testing regime we usually engage in has now taken place and the papers are being marked externally. All pupils missed some schooling last year and these results will be one of the ways in which we ensure teaching going forwards will address any gaps.

Key Stage 4

What an exciting time to be in Year 8 at Henlow CE Academy! Since our return in September there has been a flurry of activity within the school to help children understand how the school age range change will affect them.

Now that pupils have the opportunity to stay at Henlow, we have created a team of Year 8 ambassadors who will be discussing the issues that are important to them moving forward. Uniform and the possibility of lockers are currently at the forefront of their discussions, with many more exciting aspects to debate and decide upon.

Our Year 9 curriculum is unlike any other, offering children the chance to study new subjects and earn additional qualifications, learning new transferable skills that will be beneficial to them throughout their GCSE journey. To help provide an insight into this curriculum, we have also created a dedicated Key Stage 4 Google classroom full of informative videos, many of which have also been shared on social media. We are delighted to have received such a positive response to these clips. The progression from Year 8 into Year 9 and Key Stage 4 provides children with the chance to continue their education with one fewer transition point. For those staying at Henlow into Year 9, all you need to do is to keep coming to Henlow! There isn't anything else for you to worry about. Travelling to & from School

Parking

We would encourage pupils (where possible) to come to school by walking, cycling or scooting. If you are dropping off your child by car please use the designated car parks by The Pavilion, Scout Hut or The Five Bells.

Where possible (except for pupils arriving by bus or taxi) we would ask that Year 5 & 6 pupils enter by the front gates and Year 7 & 8 by the back gates due to the location of their relevant teaching classrooms.

Please do not congregate by the school gates to reduce the risks of large groups forming. Please arrange to meet your child at the end of the day off site.

At Henlow Academy we are committed to reducing the amount of traffic on the roads leading to the school grounds. With this in mind we would appreciate if you are dropping another child off at Raynsford, please let the Henlow pupils walk the rest of the way to school by using the path by the cricket pavilion to the back gate of the school or round to the front of school depending on their year group.

School Buses

Travel on school buses is only permitted if you have been awarded or pay for a bus pass from Central Bedfordshire Schools Transport. You can not travel via the school buses to friends for tea etc. if you do not have a pass for that bus on a given route. Seats are limited and allocated.

Central Bedfordshire have a code of conduct for pupils travelling to and from school on the school buses. Please make sure you and your child(ren) are familiar with the conditions.

Pupil Equipment

All pencil cases will have been sent home to be restocked over half term. Please can you child(ren) has all the right equipment they need for school ensure your everyday. We are seeing an increasing number of pupils that are turning up to lessons without even a pen and pencil. As part of The Henlow Home School Partnership, pupils should attend school properly equipped. Please note that pupils are not able to share equipment and the school are not able to provide pupils with missing equipment.

All pupils needs a pencil case which contains ALL of the following:


- Cartridge pen, handwriting pen or a friction pen (blue and black)

- Coloured pencils (not felt tips)
- Ink eraser pen (if using a cartridge pen)
- Green pen (friction pen preferred)
- Rubber
- Pencil sharpener (which can collect shavings)
- Glue Stick
- Scissors
- Highlighters
- Scientific calculator
- Protractor

When the children return to school, please remember that they should only be bringing items essential to their learning to school. Toys and games etc are not permitted.



As the nights are drawing in, please remind your child(ren) about the importance of road safety. Whether they walk or cycle home, are walking from the bus home or get collected in the car, once they have left the school site they need to be visible.



Remember!

Please ensure all money sent into school is in a sealed envelope and has your child's name, class, what the money is for and the amount of money on the front.

Please make sure that all your child's clothes and property is clearly named. If your child has lost any items please make sure they check lost property ASAP.

The school office aren't able to call home if your child forgets something they need that day at school. Please ensure your child checks their timetable and brings all they need each day. ALL children are required to bring in a named water bottle daily. The school do not have cups to provide to children who do not bring a water bottle and the canteen no longer sells bottles of drinks.

We are not accepting cash at the moment. Please make payments and donations through the ParentMail app. Go to payments and then click 'shop'.

Please can all parents and carers check their child/ren's ParentMail accounts and ensure they are in credit.

Please be aware that Breakfast Club runs from 8:00am until 8:30am and must be booked in advance. Staff are not available to supervise children before 8:00am and therefore children are not authorised to be on site before this due to safeguarding and health & safety.

Don't be late!

If your child(ren) arrive after 9:20am they will be marked in late.

Let us know!

You can report your child(ren) absence from school by phone the school office on 01462 813733 or through the ParentMail app.

Things to remember!

You can be prosecuted if your child has unauthorised absences from school.

IF YOUR CHILD IS GOING TO BE ABSENT FROM SCHOOL YOU MUST CONTACT THE SCHOOL TO LET US KNOW WHY YOUR CHILD WON'T BE IN SCHOOL OTHERWISE THE ABSENCE WILL BE UNAUTHORISED.

Looking after other children, going shopping and waiting in for deliveries are not valid reasons to keep your child off school and will be marked as unauthorised absences.

Parents can request to take children out of school during term time by writing to the Attendance Officer. However, holidays are only granted in exceptional circumstances. Absences taken without permission will be recorded as unauthorised and a fine will be issued.

Attendance Matters



- \Rightarrow You can report your child absence from school through the ParentMail app.
- \Rightarrow 97% attendance means your child will have missed 6 days of school throughout the year.
- \Rightarrow 90% attendance means that your child will have been absent for the equivalent of one half day every week.
- ⇒ If you take a two week holiday during term time your child's attendance will automatically be reduced to less than 95%. A two week holiday each year in school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed. This is the equivalent of a whole term and can have a real impact on your child's literacy and numeracy skills.
- \Rightarrow If your child does not attend school regularly and you fail to work with the school and The Education Welfare Service, you may be fined up to £2500 and in extreme cases sent to prison.

Frequently asked questions

Q. My child has a tummy bug and isn't well enough for school. What do I need to do?

A. Call the school office on 01462 813733 or use the ParentMail app before 9:00am to let us know. Children should not return to school after a sickness bug for 48 hours after their last episode of sickness/diarrhoea.

Q. I need to take my child to the dentist next week, do I need to let school know?

A. Yes please! Please inform the school office. Where possible please try to make appointments outside school hours/during school holidays. If that is not possible please make them for the start or end of the school day.

Q. I sometimes struggle to get all of my 3 children to school before the school gates close, being 5-10 minutes late doesn't really make that much difference does it?

A. It is important for all children to be in school on time as it can be upsetting for the child and disruptive for the rest of the class when children are late. Children who are late need to arrive via the school office and will get a late mark.
